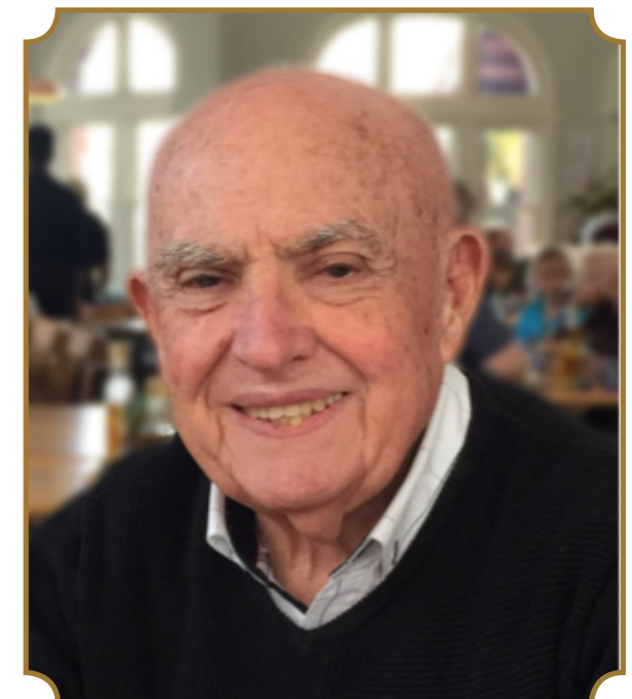
Vale Denis Hagan

Chairman's Report

As I write this report the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA Inc is in a strong financial position. This position is attributed to the hard work of the Board of Directors during this trying Covid time.

During 2021 - 2022 the Foundation has been able to maintain their commitment to providing support to the community.

This year we supported the following:
\$15,000 to the RSLWA. This was to support their Christmas Hampers for Veterans (Hampers for Vets) project. This grant funded 300 Christmas hampers.

\$20,000 to MNDAWA. The funds supported the employment of a Respiratory Nurse to create treatment plans for those MND patients at FSH, SCGH and SJOG Midland.

\$10,000 and \$2,000 to the Lions Cancer Institute. These funds were used to help fund the mobile Cancer Screening coach and for The Special Children's Christmas big Day out.

\$30,000 to SLSWA. This is an ongoing grant for their TOAD and RiseUp Camps, continued support of the statewide Youth Program & Pathways, the Youth Leaders Program and also the SLSWA Nipper and Youth Awards.

\$5,000 to the Perth Metro Pipe Band. The Foundation has supported the band for many years and they perform at the Annual Gala Ball and the Charity Golf Day.

\$850 to Freemasons WA Annual Charity Golf Day. As well as being a hole sponsor the Foundation has a team of four playing in the event.

As part of our Grant program the Board has made available \$1,000 per Lodge to be granted to a charity of their choice. This money is used to match the donation that the Lodge is making. Over the past year the following Lodges have taken advantage of this:
Lodge St Andrew donated \$1,000 to the Breast Cancer Research Foundation. This donation was matched by the Foundation so became a \$2,000 donation.

Lodge Ivanhoe supported Scott McAdam who was taking part in the Perth Kilt Run at the City of Armadale Highland Gathering by donating \$1,000 to Beyond Blue. The Foundation also made a donation for \$1,000.

Lodge Balmoral and Sir Walter Scott-Breadalbane supported Andrew Anderson and Movember with donations of \$200 and \$700 respectively. These donations were matched by the Foundation. We are pleased that some of the Lodges have taken the opportunity to become more involved with the Foundation in their local community and it would be great to see more Lodges connect with their community.

This year saw the terms of some Board members come to an end. I would like to say a heartfelt thank you to Kevin McKay, past Chairman of the Foundation and Past District Grand Master. Kevin has been a part of the Board for many years and has given a large amount of time and energy to the Foundation.

I would also like to thank Edward (Eddie) Lennie for his time on the Board. Eddie was only on the Board for a short time but afforded the Board with a wealth of knowledge, experience and time.

Kevin and Eddie were replaced on the Board by Alan MacKenzie (DGL Treasurer) and Lindsay Mitchell (Lodge Kilwinning). Welcome to you both.

We unfortunately said goodbye to Denis Hagan who passed following heart issues. Denis was on the Board for many years and was a Past District Grand Master and Treasurer of the Foundation.

I would like to express my thanks to all the Scottish Lodges in this District for their continuing support of the Foundation.

During the year I attended a number of events, which has been good considering the past few years. On Friday 29th October 2021 the SMCFWA Annual Charity Golf Day was held at Wanneroo Golf Club. There was again no set dinner, but sponsors were welcomed back and the 48 players who played had a fantastic day. Thank you to those who attended. The 2022 event will be held on Monday 17th October 2022 at Wanneroo Golf Club.

During December 2021 Kevin and myself met with the Lions Cancer Institute to present their Grant cheques of \$10,000 and \$2,000. On Wednesday 23rd December 2021 Andrew Bruce and Kevin McKay represented me and the Foundation at the SLSWA Rise Up Camp at Pt Peron to present their Grant cheque. They watched the participants partake in set tasks and had lunch with them.

On Thursday 10th March 2022 the chairman of MNDAWA, Samar Aoun BSc (Hons) MPH PhD, attended the Foundation office with Peta McLean and myself for the cheque presentation of their grant. We chatted about the Grant that we gave them and the benefit to the community it would provide. On Monday 9th May 2022 I attended with 3 other players the Freemasons WA Charity Golf Day at Wanneroo Golf Club. We again had a wonderful time and came runners up.

On Saturday 25th June 2022 myself, my wife June, Peta McLean and her husband William attended the SLSWA Awards of Excellence evening. I presented two awards, one for Youth Surf Life Saver of the Year and Young Volunteer of the Year. The SLSWA Nipper & Youth awards were postponed until 8th October 2022 and the Coastal Bravery awards were postponed until 2023.

On Thursday 30th June 2022 the Foundation held a morning tea at their office for the new DGM Clive Lynn and for Grand Master Mason, William Ramsay McGhee and the Grand Secretary William M S Semple from the Grand Lodge of Scotland. Unfortunately, the Grand Master Mason was unable to attend as he had been unwell and was in transit from the UK. We presented the Grand Secretary with a cheque for \$23,000 for their Make it a Million Grant program for Prostate Cancer.

On Saturday 27th August 2022 the SMCFWA Annual Gala Dinner was held at the Duxton hotel. This event was attended by 94 people who danced, ate and drank the night away. Thank you to those who attended and to the Lodges who supported this event.

During the year the Lions Cancer Institute had the benefit of becoming a grant recipient.

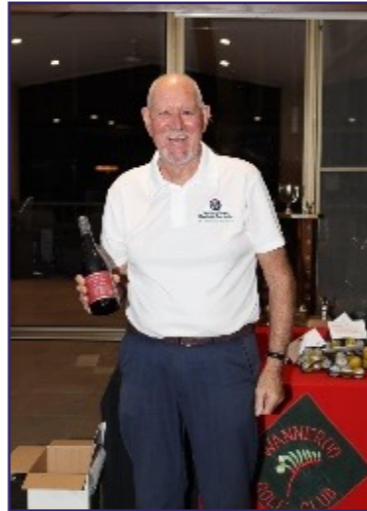

A good day was had by all and thanks to Brother Fred Geldart for organising this event.



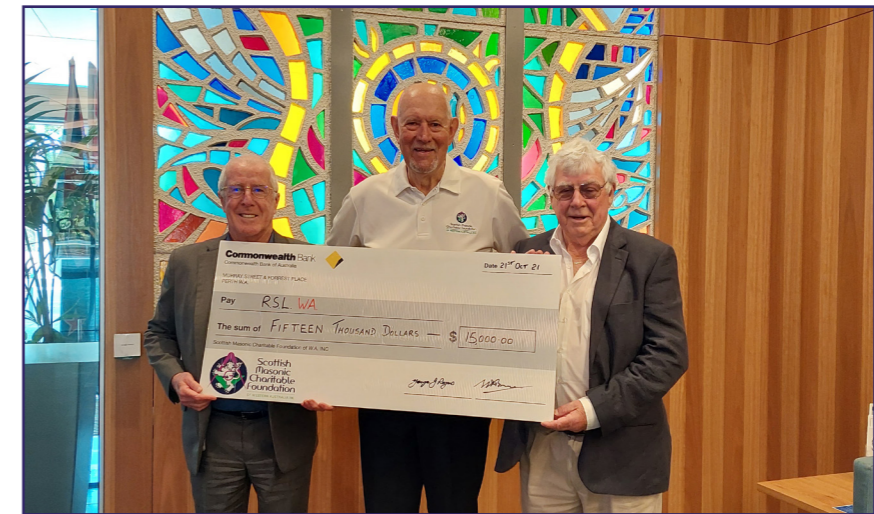

RSLWA

The Foundation was happy to again support the RSLWA in their Christmas Hampers for Veterans (Hampers for Vets) project by providing a grant of \$15,000.

This project makes available over 300 hampers, which are delivered to veterans and their families at Christmas time. The project was established as the RSLWA became aware of Veterans who were facing financial hardship and would go without during the festive season.

The cheque was presented to RSLWA CEO John McCourt, JP, at RSLWA office in Adelaide Terrace Perth.



MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE ASSOCIATION of WA (MNDAWA)

MNDAWA approached the Foundation at the beginning of 2022 with regard to applying for a grant to help support a Respiratory Physio as part of their Breath a Little Easier project.

This project will enable the Physio to work with the Respiratory departments at SCGH, FSH and SJOG Midland to identify and create treatment plans for those people who are most in need.

The Foundation approved this grant of \$20,000. The cheque was presented to the Chairman of MNDAWA Samar Aoun at the Foundations office.

LIONS CANCER INSTITUTE

The Foundation was approached by the Lions Cancer Institute to provide a couple of grants.

The first grant was for \$10,000 to help fund the free mobile cancer screening coach. This coach travels around the metropolitan, rural and regional areas of Western Australia to provide free cancer screening services to the general public.

There has been more than 75,000 people who have taken advantage of this free service and more than 26% of these have been referred for additional medical attention with 1,100 lesions found to be life threatening. There has been over 700 people who have been saved by early detection.

The service is free and run by Lions Club Members, volunteers including medical practitioners. The cost of this service would normally be \$360 per patient.

The second grant for \$2,000 was for the The Special Childrens Christmas Big Day Out. This event is for Terminally ill, Special Needs and Less Fortunate Children and their Carers. The Grant sponsored 20 children.



SMCFWA & WA Scottish Lodges Grants

As part of the Foundations Grant program an amount of \$10,000 is set aside for use by the Scottish Lodges. This allows each Lodge to make a donation of up to \$1,000 and apply for the Foundation to match this during each financial year. This past year four Lodges have applied for these grants.

Lodge St Andrew approached the Foundation regarding matching a donation that they were making to the Breast Cancer Research Foundation for \$1,000. The Foundation matched this donation and Bro Kevin McKay representing the Foundation and Lodge St Andrew presented the cheque to the Calendar Girls who were fundraising for this cause.

Lodge Ivanhoe were making a donation of \$1,000 to Beyond Blue to support Scott McAdam to partake in the Kilt Run. An application was made to the Foundation to match this donation. The application was approved and a donation of \$2,000 was made.

Lodge Balmoral and Lodge Sir Walter Scott - Breadalbane approached the Foundation to again support Andrew Anderson during Movember. Lodge Balmoral requested to match \$200 and Lodge Sir Walter Scott -Breadalbane requested \$700. Both of these requests were approved and amount of \$400 and \$1,400 were paid to Movember.

Perth Metro Pipe Band

2021-2022 was again a challenging period for Perth Metro Pipe Band due to the Covid pandemic. However, pre-covid activities such as competitions, performances and rehearsals are now in full swing as we finally see the back of pandemic restrictions.

Perth Metro was fortunate to practice safely throughout the local Covid outbreak, utilising outdoor practice venues in the summer. This practice was bolstered by an online challenge to all members to display their talents over the ordinarily quiet festive season by posting videos of their performances on social media.



In between Covid restrictions, Perth Metro competed at three local contests over the past twelve months, placing first in two contests by narrow margins and second at the Armadale Highland Games. Perth Metro overcame sweltering and decidedly un-Scottish weather at the Swan Valley Highland Games, held at Elmars Brewery, to regain the grade three title. This win was backed up at the Fremantle Highland Gathering, hosted at the Fremantle Sailing Club in May.

Perth Metro was honoured to perform at the Telethon Parade and the ANZAC Day parade - the first since 2019. Band members were delighted to support those who have served

their Nation and to support a fantastic children's charity.

Like many community organisations, Perth Metro relies on fundraising and sponsorship to operate. Uniforms and instruments are not cheap, and the impact of Covid has restricted opportunities to raise these funds. Perth Metro is both humbled and grateful for the ongoing generous support provided by the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation and the kindness and encouragement extended by so many men and women from within the Scottish masonic fraternity.

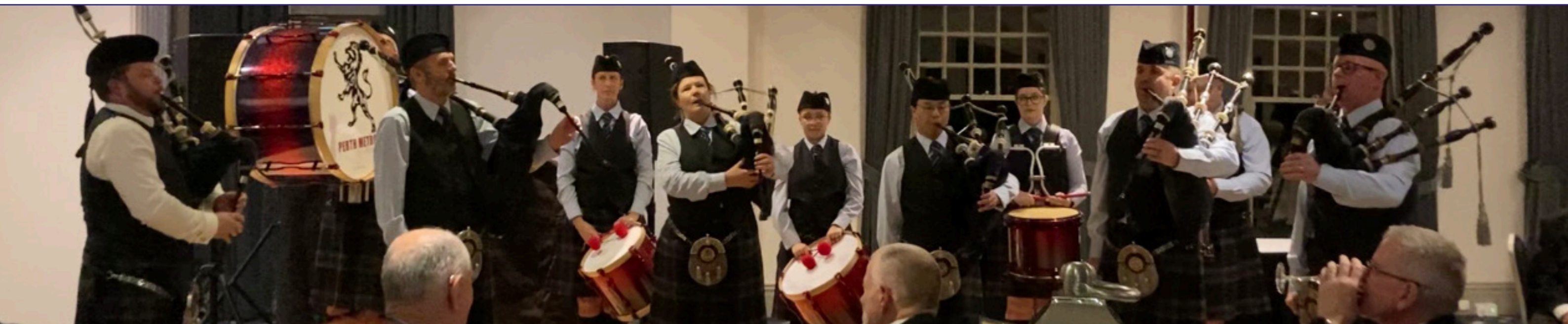

SLSWA

The Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA (Inc) plays a significant role in developing young lifesavers within Western Australia through their support of Surf Life Saving WA (SLSWA).

Over the 2021/22 season, funding provided by the Foundation has assisted SLSWA in four key areas, namely:

1. Continued support of the statewide Youth Program & Pathways
2. Continued support of the Youth Leaders Program (YLP)
3. Continued support and further enhancement of the popular Youth Development Camps -Rise Up and T.O.A.D.
4. Continued support as presenting rights partner of the SLSWA Nipper and Youth Awards

1.Youth Program & Pathways

SLSWA's Youth Program was designed to increase engagement and participation of Youth Members(13-16 years) across WA.

The ultimate aim of the Youth Program is to engage, enthuse and educate all graduating 'Nippers' and new youth members, regardless of ability in the surf sport discipline, and aid the retention and development of members.

The program provides learning experiences across four main areas, namely lifesaving, training, leadership and surf sports.

SLSWA offers statewide Youth Pathway Courses, empowering its youth members to actively engage in the various areas of Surf Life Saving. These courses include the Youth Age Manager, Youth Coach, Youth Event Producer, Youth Trainer and Youth Official.

2.Youth Leaders Program

Within the broader Youth Program Curriculum is the opt in Youth Leaders Program (YLP). Available to all youth members, the optional Youth Leaders Program tracks the hours a youth member puts into lifesaving, training and surf sports.

There are three recognition levels to the program; Bronze, Silver and Gold, which are increasingly difficult to obtain. To achieve Gold Level, members have accumulated in excess of 230 volunteer hours during their period as a Surf Life Saving youth member (13-16 year olds).

The certificates achieved at each level of the YLP carry the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA's logo.

This past year, an impressive 34 youth members achieved Gold level status in the YLP. These members will be recognised at the 2022 Nipper & Youth Awards presented by the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA, which will occur in October 2022. This is a significant increase on the 17 youth members who achieved Gold level status in the 2020/21 season.

3. 2022 Nipper and Youth Awards, presented by the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA

As COVID-19 delayed the Nipper & Youth Awards in April 2022, we were forced to push back the event until 8 October 2022. Once again, Woodside Energy will be hosting the ceremony, with Jesse Phillips, former Olympian, to be our Master of Ceremonies for the afternoon.

4. Youth Development Camps – Rise Up and T.O.A.D.

Annually SLSWA runs two development camps for youth members. These camps provide opportunities for teamwork and leadership skills to be developed by those attending. Rise Up camp ran from Monday, 20 December through to Thursday, 23 December 2021. T.O.A.D camp ran from Tuesday, 4 January through to Friday, 7 January 2022.



T.O.A.D. (Teamwork, Opportunity and Development) Camp

The SLSWA Youth Camp, known as T.O.A.D Camp, held at Ern Halliday Camp, saw seventy-two 13 and 14-year-olds from 28 clubs enjoying four days of fun and learning, along with plenty of sunshine, blue skies and clear waters.

Teams worked together to challenge themselves and their leadership skills through crate climbs, rock climbing, the flying fox, and a giant swing.

Participants also had to lead a blindfolded team through a set course, problem solve several structural challenges with newspaper and spaghetti and trust each other to shave a balloon on top of their heads without it bursting.

A dedicated crew of Sorrento SLSC volunteers, including some youth members, hosted a successful beach day for the TOAD'ies with relays, first aid scenarios, frisbee and IRB/RWC familiarisation.

On Friday, the camp concluded with an Amazing Race, where Toadies were able to practice their radio skills, identifying BEN signs, completing team challenges and responding to first aid scenarios.

As well as fun activities, all 72 Toadies completed and achieved their Radio Operator Certificate!

Rise Up Camp

The Rise Up Camp, for 15 and 16 year olds, was held at the Point Peron Camp School. With a 30% increase in participants since 2021's camp, sixty-one (61) participants from 27 Surf Life Saving clubs attended, forming fantastic friendships with other youth members from all around

Western Australia.

With Point Peron Camp School perched on the beachside, activities took full advantage of the coastal access; each day filled with various activities such as kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding, snorkeling, archery, abseiling, bike riding and even building a raft and testing its seaworthiness!



Outweighing all other activities for teamwork and sheer determination was the Crate Stack, with this year's campers breaking the record with 19 towered, only to be broken again shortly after with a whopping 21, setting a big challenge for future campers. During the activities, some great leadership skills were also developed.

Whilst on camp, participants had the opportunity to gain their Advanced Resuscitation Techniques qualification. Having this award benefits both the camp participant and their club, as it means the youth member can use more advanced lifesaving equipment and techniques.

On Wednesday, guests from the Scottish Masonic Charitable Foundation of WA (SMCFWA) popped by for a visit. The SMCFWA has long been a supporter of the youth programs and once again it was wonderful to have them along to camp where they presented the group with a cheque, representing their ongoing support for SLSWA and the youth members.
